### Heroes in our midst.

Edward (Ted) James Kersey, 92, joined the Canadian Army in 1943 at the age of 19 and served as a dispatch motorcycle rider with the Royal Canadian Ordnance Corp. Recently, during a Sunday afternoon ceremony at Glen Abbey United Church Ted was officially awarded the rank of Knight of the French National Order of the Legion of Honour. Ted is among approximately 1,000 Canadians who will receive the award over the course of a campaign by the French government to commemorate the 70th anniversary of the Allied landings in Normandy. While Kersey appreciates his recognition by the French government he's not sure the term hero is appropriate for him. "Our freedom was threatened by a madman. Somebody had to stand up and why not me?" he said.



"I don't think there was anything heroic about it. I just wanted to do my bit." Rev. Kersey moved to Oakville in 2003, and is now living at Delmanor Residence in Glen Abbey. The full article, written by David Lea can be found at www.insidehalton.com

Basil Hermanus, 80, was recently presented with a "Heroes in the Home" award from the Mississauga/Halton Community Care Access Centre. Basil and his wife Naomi have been married for 61 years, and in 2012 Naomi was hospitalized for 84 days. Since her hospitalization, Basil has served as her primary caregiver, even during his own cancer treatments. Basil does not consider himself a hero. "To me, it's a great pleasure to be recognized for the little I consider I do for my wife. I realized what the working woman has to do. She did all the cooking and looking after the family. Now that I'm doing this, I say, My gosh, look at what she had to go through. This is so very important for men to understand".



### **St John's Trust Funds** some points to ponder from the Chair of Trustees, Ross Huchison

The returns on our invested Trust Funds are critical to the continued strength of our programs. Estates today have escalated significantly. Appreciation in our residences has been dramatic. Add to this the invested retirement funds many of us have and estates are much larger than we would have considered possible. Contributing corporate shares can be a very tax effective approach. You avoid capital gains tax, get a full value tax receipt and St John's also receives full value.

Review your will today. Contact your lawyer or create a simple codicil to update your bequest. Rather than bequeathing a fixed amount, you might consider gifting a percentage of your estate to St. John's. Bequests of \$500 or \$1,000 are not in line with the times, whereas a bequest of 2% to 3% of the value of your estate can result in a meaningful donation and barely impact the amount you pass on to your other heirs. ### **Holy Week Reflection and Worship:**

Our focus this Holy Week will be on the cross. There will be time provided during the week for reflection on Holy Week – music, readings and an opportunity to make crosses to leave at the front of the Church.

On Maundy Thursday there will be a large cross lit with tea lights which people will be invited to extinguish during the last hymn, then the Christ candle will be carried down the aisle, leaving behind all of our crosses and darkness.



On Good Friday as people leave the service in silence each person will be invited to "take up their cross", choosing one of the crosses that has been made during the week.

On Easter Morning the darkness of the week will be left behind, beautiful flowers will enhance our sanctuary and we will dance our way to the new life and light offered by the resurrected Christ.

We hope you will choose to walk the pathway of Holy Week with us.

### **New Hope Oakville Project**


